## Explore This Hidden Landscape - Just An Hour From Albuquerque



Discover hoodoos and beautifully-weathered sandstone in a unique slot canyon site.

Sand was the only constant in this former inland seabed, and pressure hardened it to sandstone over time. Then ejected rocks and ash from the nearby Jemez volcanic field covered the sandstone a few million years ago.

Relentless water and wind wore the top away. The harder ejected rock protected the softer ash tuff underneath, and today you see a sculpted landscape of conic rocks and slot canyons.

Ten lucky photographers will explore and photograph these spectacular formations in the morning, with my professional guidance.

We'll return to Albuquerque's nationally-renowned Pueblo Harvest Cafe for lunch, followed by some instruction on how to enhance your morning pictures in Lightroom to resemble what you saw in the field.

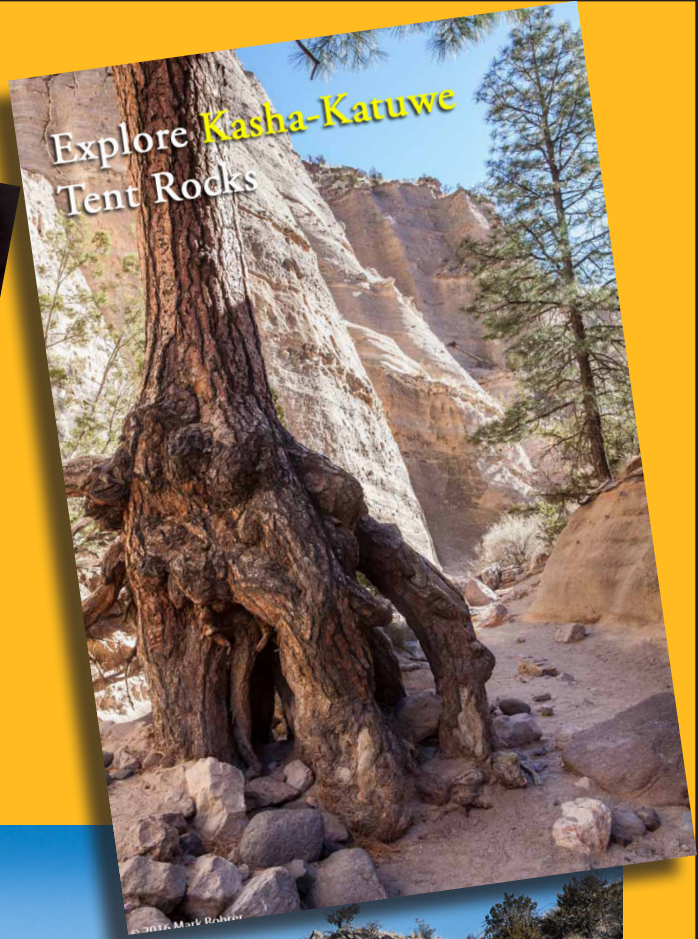
